

Technology Policy Dolphin Kids Template

The National Education Association (United states) suggests that an effective technology policy contain the following elements:

<p>Motivation: Why you/your school has developed this policy. ie. Connect your schools core values to technology and online behavior.</p>
<p>Definitions: Clarify key words (i.e. educational purposes)</p>
<p>Acceptable Use: i.e.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Personal devices must not interrupt instructional/learning time ○ Respect for the privacy of other students ○ Report inappropriate conduct
<p>Unacceptable use: ie.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Phoning/texting (considered disruptive practices) in study areas/cafeteria/classrooms/hallways during class time ○ Cyber-bullying/harassment/intimidation via social media/messages including Snapchat, blogs, chat-rooms, Facebook, Twitter
<p>Consequences: ie.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Student-teacher discussion striving for a resolution
